Specific to crisis response, Montgomery County currently provides the community with two 24/7 hotlines, 2 peer warm lines, a 24/7 mobile crisis team, and two crisis residential programs. There is also a small crisis walk in center for adults. The Department of HHS has been working toward the development of a new walk-in Crisis Receiving Center to serve all ages, 24 hour, 365 days a year. This center will serve any individual experiencing a behavioral health crisis, including substance use and overdose related crises, and will function as a 24/7 Drug & Alcohol Assessment and Referral site. oUpwards of 25% of all behavioral health crisis calls currently fielded by the hotline and mobile teams are for individuals who report substance use, including: opioid use, withdraw, and overdose. The future CRC will be a place where those individuals can go for assistance and referral. Currently in Montgomery County, we have a robust offering of someone to call (2 hotlines, 2 warm lines) and someone to come (mobile crisis team). A 24/7, all ages Crisis Receiving Center will provide individuals and families with a key resource to any ideal crisis response system: somewhere to go. A CRC, also called a 'diversion center' or 'crisis resource center' will provide an alternative to Emergency Departments for individuals in crisis. The CRC will be staffed with a multidisciplinary team of helpers including: peer specialists, certified recovery specialists, case managers, clinicians, nurses, and physicians. A one-stop shop for individuals and families in crisis to find help and manage a crisis situation. The CRC will also provide an accessible option for first responders looking to connect individuals to assistance, as an alternative to transport to an Emergency Department or utilization of the criminal justice system'	3	Approved
